

Brian McCoy, Bureau Chief

Brian McCoy is a graduate of Nova University holding a master's degree in public administration/criminal justice, a bachelor's degree in public administration/criminal justice from Saint Thomas University, and a bachelor's degree in psychology from Ashford University.

Chief McCoy joined the Division as an investigator on November 10, 2003 and he has been investigating healthcare provider fraud. He was promoted to lieutenant in July of 2008 and then to captain in November of 2009. Prior to joining the Division he worked as the coordinator of public safety programs for the Institute of Public Safety at Broward Community College. He spent five years with Motorola as a security manager and 25 years with the Fort Lauderdale Police Department where he retired as a detective sergeant. During his time with Fort Lauderdale he was a sergeant with the Metropolitan Intelligence Unit (MIU), a multi agency task force investigating organized criminal organizations where he supervised the strategic intelligence unit and analytical function. He supervised a 30 man SWAT team, with responsibilities for budgeting, training and full SWAT operations. He also served as chairman of the Florida Intelligence Unit. He is a Florida state certified instructor and taught as an adjunct professor at Florida International University for five years. In April, 2017, McCoy was named Bureau Chief over the Workers' Compensation Fraud Bureau.
