Mark A. Reinhalter is the Counsel for Longshore in the U.S. Department of Labor Solicitor's Office Black Lung and Longshore Legal Services Division. Mr. Reinhalter received his law degree in 1982 from Suffolk University Law School in Boston, Massachusetts, and his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1978 from Bates College in Lewiston, Maine. After clerking for Judge Jack G. Day of the Ohio Court of Appeals, Mr. Reinhalter served as staff counsel to the Maine State Workers' Compensation Commission. Subsequently, as an attorney in the City Solicitor's Office for Worcester, Massachusetts, he administered that city's self-insured workers' compensation program and defended compensation claims by City employees. In 1987, Mr. Reinhalter joined the Massachusetts law firm of Ricklefs, Uehlein & Nason practicing workers' compensation defense trial litigation. He joined DOL's Solicitor's Office in 1991 working primarily with the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Act. From 1997 to 1999, Mr. Reinhalter worked as a trial attorney in the Plan Benefits Security Division enforcing ERISA's fiduciary provisions. From 2001 to 2003, he served as the Counsel for Energy Employees' Compensation. Since 2003, Mr. Reinhalter has been responsible for litigation and legal advice under the LHWCA and related statutes including the Defense Base Act and the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act.
