Born in Jacksonville, Florida, Mr. Broussard has been a resident of Orange County, Florida since 1957. Mr. Broussard was admitted to the Florida Bar in 1980 and the United States District Court, Middle District of Florida, in 1981. He has maintained an active Central Florida law practice as a civil trial lawyer since his admission to the practice of law.

His practice has included the defense of general liability, bodily injury, professional liability, automobile liability and premises liability matters. Mr. Broussard's practice has consisted of representing insurance carriers and their insureds in the defense of personal injury, commercial liability, and other insurance related litigation in state and federal courts.

Further, Mr. Broussard has substantial experience in all aspects of the defense of workers' compensation claims. He has handled trial and appeals on workers' compensation matters. He has also litigated subrogation claims. He has prepared the briefs and presented oral argument before the First and Fifth District Courts of Appeal.
