After a long and hard winter suffering from his chronic lung disease Cole visited Give Kids The World Village in Kissimmee, Florida with his mom, 3 siblings, and Nanny and Poppy. He hopped and skipped and ran and even hugged the Mayor, and that's a miracle for this cute kid from New York.

A stay at the Village is much more than a weeklong vacation; it's a chance for these families to laugh together, play together, and create unforgettable memories away from hospital stays and medical treatments.

"Cole had the most magical time, from the moment he was greeted at the airport until he waved goodbye. It was such a break for him to be able to experience life without having the anxiety of doctors' appointments and procedures hanging over his head. He was amazed by every aspect of the village," Cole's mom said. "I remember one night after visiting a park for the day, we were exploring the village. Cole just ran from one place to another. He went into the movie theater and got a snack. He ran off to give the Mayor a hug. He went and laughed at the snoring tree. He ran off and hopped on a ride with his Poppy. He was so excited and happy that he wasn't

complaining of his legs hurting or his lungs burning and just kept hopping from one place to another."

In 2020, the Village closed to wish families like Cole's due to the global pandemic, delaying more than 6,000 wishes. Despite the closure, the Village created a unique opportunity last December for visitors and donors to experience – Night of a Million Lights. Night of a Million Lights was designed to raise funds to ensure that the wishes of critically ill children could return bigger and better than ever before once the time was right to reopen. USA Today named Night of a Million Lights the "Number One Thing To Do in December in Orlando."

It was such a huge success that the Village has decided to do it again this year and the [Workers' Compensation Institute](#) is playing it's part in bringing it back.
