Lawyers complying with requirements in other states that do not have an ethics/professionalism requirement nevertheless must satisfy the ethics/professionalism requirement set forth in BCLE Reg. 201 to be considered in full compliance with New Jersey's CLE requirement.

MEDIATOR CREDITS

Pursuant to the Administrative Order entered by Chief Justice Major B. Harding on 9-11-98 (effective 4-1-00), among other requirements, mediator certification renewal on or after 4-1-02, requires a minimum of 16 hours of Continuing Mediator Education (CME) credits to be completed, and shall include a minimum of 4 hours of mediation Ethics, 2 hours of Interpersonal Violence, and 1 hour of Cultural Diversity in each two year renewal cycle, including the two years following initial certification.

All PMI programs are 60 minutes to meet CEU requirements, so mediators are able to report 1.0 hour of PMI program time as 1.2 CME and/or CLE hours. CME/CLE credit time is shown in parentheses. This program provides up to 9.0 (10.8) hours of "General" Continuing Education Training credits, PLUS up to 2.0 (2.4) hours of Ethics, 2.0 (2.4) hours of Interpersonal Violence, and 1.0 (1.2) hour of Cultural Diversity. There's also 1.0 (1.2) hour of Technology time for attorneys needing that CLE credit.

- 1. Mediators must be registered for the conference to receive credit.
- 2. Mediators must check in at the CLE booth.
- 3. A Certificate of Attendance shall be provided at the PMI table.
- 4. Mediators self-report hours to their areas of certification at the time of their renewal.

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August 2023 WCI/WCEC Oral Argument Case Summaries

1D22-2887, Christy Siena v. Orange Cnty. Fire Rescue/CCMSI

This case challenges an order disqualifying a firm appearing before the Office of the Judges of Compensation Claims ("OJCC"). Christy Siena retained Bichler & Longo, PLLC to seek chapter 440 death benefits after her firefighter spouse died from brain cancer, and the carrier retained Broussard, Cullen & Eldridge, P.A. on behalf of the employer to argue that receipt of chapter 112 benefits (including death benefits) by Siena and her nowdeceased spouse precluded the claim. After the judge of compensation claims ("JCC") rendered a final order for the employer, Siena obtained separate appellate counsel and appealed. Shortly thereafter, an attorney who had worked on the case for the Broussard firm transferred to the Bichler firm. The employer filed a motion with the OJCC to disqualify the Bichler firm from continuing to represent Siena in the future, and the JCC granted the motion. Siena's arguments include that the JCC lacks jurisdiction because no PFB is pending and that, under these facts, the work the attorney did for the Broussard firm is not material to any claim that can possibly be before the JCC in the future.

1D22-3726, Steward Sebastian River Med. Ctr. and Sedgwick CMS and Twin City Fire Ins. Co. v. Su-Ann Belle Zilnicki


The claimant fractured her right arm and dislocated her right shoulder in a 2019 workplace fall, necessitating immediate surgery. The carrier accepted those injuries as compensable and furnished benefits on behalf of the employer. Subsequently, the claimant sought compensability of, and benefits for, overcompensation injuries to her neck and left shoulder. She supported the claims with opinions from her independent medical examiner ("IME"). The employer alleged in response that the claimant had failed to comply with pre-petition requirements, including reporting to the Employee Assistance and Ombudsman Office (§ 440.191(2)(a), Fla. Stat.). The employer also asserted misrepresentation (alleging pre-existing arthritis and/or a 2016 injury) as a defense, and it challenged the IME's opinions by Daubert objection. The judge of compensation claims rejected the defenses, found the additional diagnoses compensable, and awarded most of the claimed benefits. Issues on appeal include jurisdiction, proper application of the Daubert standard, and whether certain records (from 2016 and prior) are admissible via the servicing agent adjuster as records custodian.



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
